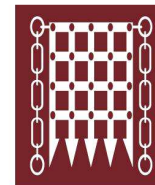

Following the allocations of STP capital funding and the Prime Minister's announcement that the ten year funding plan must make better use of capital investment to modernise buildings, what more can be done to improve infrastructure and what impact has funding and estate strategies had on generating efficiencies?*
